All the students will have an opportunity to sample injera, a traditional flatbread from Ethiopia. Our 3rd-5th graders also had a special guest, Carlaine Reynolds,

visit to share her experiences working as a member of the Peace Corps in a small, remote village in Lesotho. Ms. Carlaine spent 27 months teaching life skills and health to children at the local schools. She explained how she had to walk an hour and a half each way to get to one of the schools, just like the local children. Our students were fascinated by her stories of life without McDonalds, cars or even running water and electricity, but were relieved to learn that all the adults in the village had cell phones they charged using solar chargers.
